Biden approves the Willow project

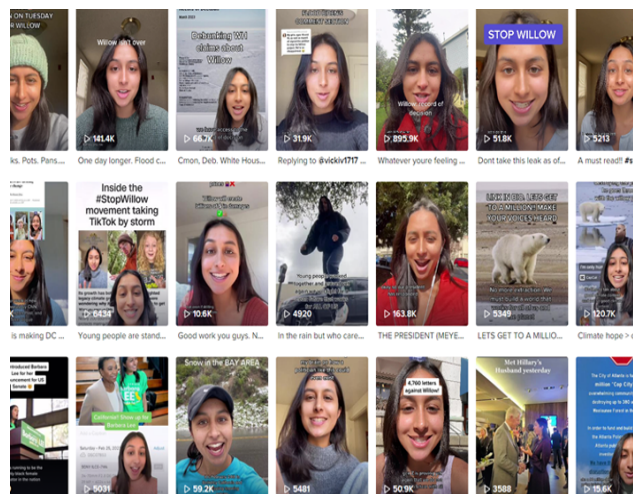
Biden approves the Willow project The Willow Project is a massive oil drilling drift on Alaska's North Slope in the National Petroleum Reserve, which is owned by the American government. The area where the project is planned holds up to 600 million barrels of oil. The project could produce up to 180,000 barrels of oil a day. Willow's supporters argue that the plan will provide employment, generate federal and state income. People have called it a "carbon bomb". Does this remind you about the "Bassines dans les Deux Sèvres" in France ?

The Willow project is directed by ConocoPhillips, which is a Houston-based energy company that has been exploring Alaska for years. The company is the only one that currently has oil drilling operations in Alaska's National Petroleum Reserve.



There are several problems about the Willow project. Such as its impact on the climate. The Willow project would add 239 million metric tons of carbon emissions to the atmosphere over the next 30 years, which is equivalent to the annual emissions of 64 coal-fired power plants.

Coastal homes, in particular, have been greatly impacted by these quickly multiplying threats.

Many people throughout the world have had to face the awful reality of having to evacuate their coastal homes. On average, 27 million people each year have to be displaced because of the looming threat of natural disasters. Houses on the coast are the most at risk of being destroyed by natural disasters due to their proximity to the sea.



For example, houses in Hemsby, a village in Norfolk County, England were demolished as the changing environment threatens the village's existence. Indeed, many houses in Hemsby are located on sand dunes that are prone to coastal erosion. This means that the dunes are slowly crumbling, and the houses are getting dangerously close to their edge.

“What is a Tornado”

Definition: A tornado is a type of storm in which powerful rotating winds form a column, which reaches from a cloud down toward the ground.

A scale is a way of measuring the power of a phenomenon. The scale of the tornado is the Enhanced Fujita Scale or EF Scale. It is measured in Fs, F0 is the weakest and F5 the strongest.

How does a tornado form :

A tornado forms during a thunderstorm. It is created by the combination of moist air and cold, dry air. These two air masses create an unstable atmosphere. A change in wind direction and an increase in wind speed with increasing height creates an invisible, horizontal spinning effect in the lower atmosphere. Rising air within the updraft, which is the

Rising air within the updraft, which is the upward moving air within a thunderstorm, tilts the horizontal rotating air, making it vertical. At this point, there is an area of rotation around 2-6 miles wide, which extends through most of the storm. It is within this area of rotation that the most intense and violent tornadoes form.



A new tornado has swept across Mississippi

This Friday evening, in Mississippi, several powerful storms and at least one tornado swept through the state destroying everything in its path. One of the most damaged cities is Rolling Fork, which is completely “gone” says the mayor. There are at least 26 deaths and dozens of injured. Rolling Fork, Winona and Huntsville are the most damaged cities as Greenville, Oxford, Tullahoma and Jackson were just pummeled by the storm. Some of the towns have maximum winds

Rolling Fork has been totally destroyed.

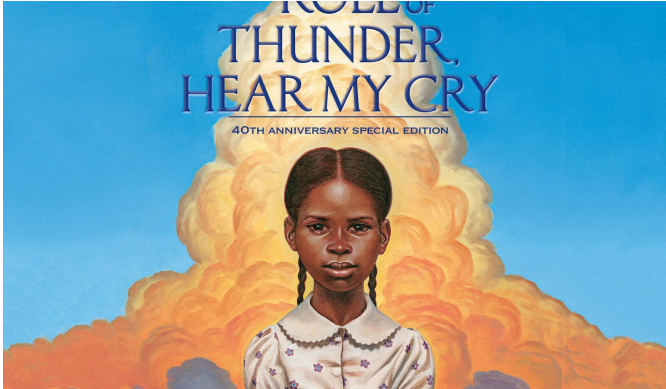

“Roll of thunder hear my cry”

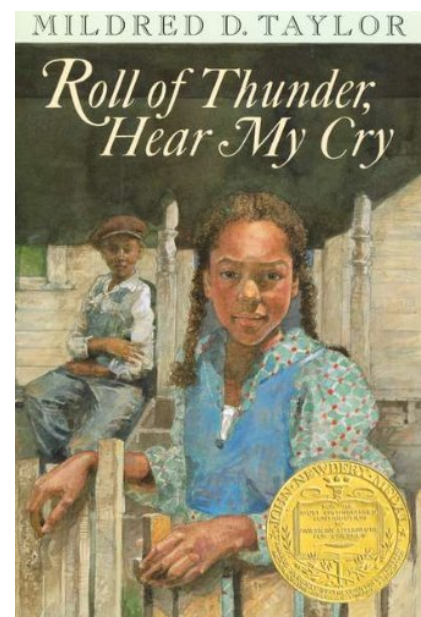


« Roll of Thunder, hear my cry » is a book about a black family living during segregation in the United States at the beginning of the 20th century. We see the events through Cassie Logan's eyes, a ten year old and the second daughter of the family. While the story advances and the tension and violence grow stronger, Cassie loses her innocence and realizes the reality of the world and the society she lives in..

Book Review:

Although the Logan family is a black family, they live on their own land. However, their ground isn't as fertile as they would like, as they can only grow cotton. Their neighbors who share their crops with a white boss are questioned in the novel, as white people are still higher up in the social hierarchy than black people. Plus, this book is full of symbols. Here, Cassie and her brother have to go to school on feet, while white people have their own shiny bus, and shiny school, with books tables and everything necessary while white pupils have dirty second-hand books, and not enough buildings for classes. The bus is really

present in the book, almost becoming a character. It reminds us of Rosa Parks' act, which started the boycott movement in Montgomery. Here, as the children are almost killed by the vehicle every day when they go to school, it becomes a habit and they can't stand it anymore. One rainy day, it's the straw that broke the camel's back. The children start a revolt, realizing that they'll have to survive in an unfair system that wants their destruction. They realize how they could be lynched, or killed, with no warning if they let their guard down.



Drought in England

Last summer, a drought was declared by experts in England. It was one of the hottest summers ever : A new UK record temperature of 40.3 °C at Coningsby was recorded on 19th July 2022.

In addition to this, Summer 2022 was the driest in the UK since 1995. Many regions, particularly in England, received less than half the average rainfall, and by the end of summer, daily river flows were among the lowest ever recorded in southern England. The amount of water stock in reservoirs was lacking, so some agriculture fields were abandoned.

The combination of dry and hot weather led people to use more water, with peak demand increasing by 40% in some areas and water companies had to supply hundreds of millions of litres of extra water each day.

In 2023, farmers are preparing for a difficult growing year, and supermarkets have rationed sales of produce, including tomatoes, cucumbers, and broccoli. Indeed, heat and water stress has coincided with grain filling and with flowering, which has led to the loss of yield potential. Milk production is also down nationally due to a lack of food for cows.

The government has asked the public to save water, and has launched a Water's Worth Saving campaign. Even after winter the reservoirs have still not refilled, and this February was the driest February in England since 1993.

In the world, the risk of drought has also increased sharply . Experts and scientists have discovered that such a drought normally happens only once every 400 years without global warming and once every 20 years if global warming is taken into consideration.

We have seen many increases in such risks all over the world: in Europe drought is now 3 or 4 times more likely, in South Asia this deadly drought wave risk is now 30 times more likely, and in the north hemisphere, a drought is 20 times more likely to occur.

This terrible drought can't pass without effects. Indeed, droughts impact the world in terms of agricultural production, electricity supply, water shortages, more frequent forest fires, reduction in harvest (in Europe) crop destruction, and deficits in rainfall... And for sure these major effects also have several dramatic consequences. In England for example, many pools are closing to preserve water. In those countries, it is particularly difficult for the population to admit it and to live in such hard situations. Therewith for the situation to get back to normal, it will require some time. So it is quite sure that these situations are going to continue this summer, that a new drought might come back, but maybe with less damage than last summer. It shows another time the impact of global warming . But even if it can be scary, several measures are taking place (re-plantation of trees for instance). In some countries, irrigation stays strictly prohibited and measures are been taken to restrict watering. Indeed, all of these little actions will help, we hope, to reduce global warming over the next few years. But it does not mean that the problem has already been solved, it may just be getting gradually better in the long term. On the picture on the left, we can see the different zones impacted by the drought in England last summer and the ones that will probably move to drought this summer

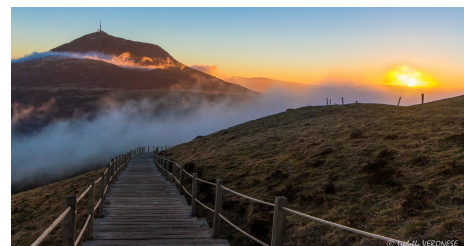
Clermont-Ferrand :

Sadly, the moment of pleasure didn’t last long, and we were back to scout the museum of Paestum, with all its magnificent murals. We admired the “Tomb of the Diver”, a majestic tomb, decorated with sublime paintings, representing dinner, life and death. Afterwards, we joined the other group, hopped once again on the bus, for a 2 hour trip to the hotel. It was our last day in the region of Campania.

Sightseeing in Rome

On our last day, we woke up early to take the bus to Rome. Once arrived, we took a quick peek at the majestic Coliseum, one of the most famous amphitheaters still preserved today. After our lunch provided to us by the Naples hotel, we visited the ancient Roman Forum which included the Basilica Aemilia, the Temple of Castor and Pollux, the Julia Curia, and the Temple of Vesta. We wandered around Rome and perceived the unbelievably beautiful Fountain of Trevi as well as the Castle of the Holy Angel. To pursue our visit, we went to the incredible Saint Peter’s Basilica which attracts an important number of tourists who want to explore the wonders of the structure. After a long wait, we were able to visit inside which was truly a sight to see. There were multiple gold accents and we even managed to attend a religious mass. Before ending the day at a lovely restaurant we noticed many tourist traps which unfortunately caught a few of our companions. Dinner consisted of a delicious Italian bruschetta, a Margherita pizza and a chocolate Crostata. Prior to our night in the bus, we witnessed the Navone square at night time and purchased a creamy and tasty gelato.



First day of the Italy trip: day in Naples

We arrived early in the morning and went to eat breakfast at a coffee shop. We ate croissants, a pastry Italians enjoy to bake, with a hot chocolate. Afterwards, we walked around Naples for a while.

The teacher explained the famous symbol of the chilli pepper, after we saw it in many shops. This symbol is called the Italian horn. It is a lucky amulet in the shape of a chilli pepper and is worn throughout Italy. Often called a cornicello or corno the Italian horn is a superstition that goes back many centuries. The Italian horn has a double meaning, it is a gift you give to people, cursing them and bringing you good luck.



We then visited the *Teatro di San Carlo* and *Palazzo Reale di Napoli*. The *Teatro di San Carlo* is the oldest and most prestigious theater in Italy as well as in Europe. Our guide explained that because the ceiling is a canvas, you have the impression of being inside a drum when you enter the theater, creating great acoustic sounds. We were also told about why there were mirrors in every lodge. The king used to come to this theater and used the mirrors to check that everyone respected the rule of waiting for him to applaud before applauding too.



As it was lunchtime, we went to eat at Solo Pizza. We ate a great margarita pizza as well as a chocolate pizza for dessert. We walked to one of the fanciest metro stations in Naples and then walked around the city until we arrived at the Musée Archéologique de Naples.

In the museum we saw many murals, statues and paintings. We learned about Alexander the Great and how he went on a long and difficult quest during which he defeated king Darius III.

The day was done so we traveled to the three star hotel, which had two pools and a beach. For dinner we had pasta with tomato sauce as an entry, sausage, corn as the main meal and a fruit salad as dessert.

The Effect of French Protests in the country:

How do foreign countries see France now?

Protests have risen all throughout France against the new pension reform, which adds two more years for work before the possibility of retirement. These protests have become more and more violent as angry French citizens go to the streets and revolt. It's clear what the French think of this new pension and their response to it, but what do other countries think?



Germans, as always, go straight to the point. According to a German newspaper, this is not a question about the reform, but rather the relationship between the French and work. "Are the French lazy?" asks rhetorically the weekly German newspaper *Der Spiegel*. "Both sides see moral and ideological issues in the reform. Behind this fight to defend pensions lies a sensitive question – what is the French relationship to work?"



Italy's *Corriere della sera* argues that the reform is rejected by several individuals, such as Nobel Prize Winner Annie Ernaux: "[Annie Ernaux] is among the signatories of a petition (...) published in the magazine *Politis* against an archaic and terribly unequal reform project. "After the 'Yellow vests' protests, (...) it is a new political test" for the president, in a difficult economic context and while inflation is hitting the poorest households, the newspaper argued.



On the other hand, Spain's neutrality is shown by its focus on the relationship between the people and their

president. *El País* names the affair as a "divorce" between Macron and part of the population. "If he backs down, his credibility as a reformist president will be affected. If he continues, [the end of his term] risks being marked by social unrest," predicted the Spanish daily. In another article, the newspaper adds that it is his "legacy is at stake."



Belgium is quick to call the retirement age a 'shibboleth' in France, due to French people being more interested in protecting their early retirement age than destroying the death penalty: when asked about the legacy of François Mitterrand, president of the Republic from 1981 to 1995, the French cite first retirement at age 60 before the abolition of death penalty. A newspaper in Belgium stated the following: "Ministers themselves have recognised that the system could be harsher in the future, especially for women. A

sudden change of course at the Prime Minister's office. The Prime Minister is now insisting (...) on the 'necessity' of the reform to save the pension system". But "the project got off to a bad start" even as "Elisabeth Borne (...) is sticking firmly to her guns".



Britain's worries seem to lie with the economy of the country rather than the cause of the protests. According to the BBC, the government will be able to stay the course and "get its bill through parliament quickly", as long as the protests stay peaceful, something that is no longer plausible. However, if the "economy starts hurting or protests turn violent, things change", wrote the BBC.

The newspaper The Financial Times links the current situation as "a test of Macron's reformist credentials": "In keeping with his pro-business economic stance, he has ruled out other approaches, such as raising taxes or cutting pensions".



Close enough to Britain's point of view, the United States is focused on France's economy as well. The CNN gave two arguments: France spends nearly 14% of its GDP on public-sector pensions, one of the highest rates among the OECD countries (Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development). Besides, "raising the retirement age to 64 will keep France below the norm in Europe and in many other developed economies, where the age at which full pension benefits apply in 65 and increasingly moving towards 67". The Atlantic observes the French's overreaction to the matter: "Why have the French dug in their heels on this seemingly necessary, perhaps unavoidable reform?" and states that there is a strong "scepticism about market economics"; their fight could be summed up as "capital or labor" in a country where "the well-off and their perceived allies are the villain".



In conclusion, we can note how the views of foreign countries on France's current situation are divided and complex. Yet, it is safe to assume that the riots and new reforms are forcing a negative public opinion not only on France's citizens, but also their government as a whole.

UK and France both on strike :What are the differences ?

In France, Macron skipped the vote to force pension changes, and faces more protests as French people revolt in the streets, setting fire to garbage and destroying stores.

More than 700 000 people in the streets in France and 70 000 in Paris, for the most followed strike since the beginning of the reform, the 23rd March.

At the beginning of his mandate, Macron wanted to create a universal pension system, without changing the retirement age of workers.

Only in 2022 did he announce his plans, changing the age at which people can retire, while incurring the wrath of the French population.

Unions such as the CGT or the CFTD are calling for mobilization, as France experiences its tenth day of strike this Tuesday 28 March.

Manifestations often experience outbursts of violence, and clashes between police and protesters have taken place in several cities.

People destroy shops, restaurants, and tag the walls of official buildings. Waves of violence between protesters and police are growing, with more arrests as the strikes continue.



At the same time, in the UK, inflation has spurred a wave of strikes across the UK not seen for 40 years. People are protesting for better pay and better work conditions which have deteriorated since Brexit and COVID-19.

The disputes are mostly over pay, with unions calling for wage rises to keep up with rising prices.

Since the 2008 financial crisis, public services have been weakened to the point they are now often struggling to help people at a basic level of support while the supposed good side of Brexit has yet to show.

Compared to France, the violence is way less important and destruction doesn't often happen. Half a million people have mobilized for the cause and for a few weeks already.

A DOLL'S HOUSE REVIEW

A doll's house by Henrik Ibsen was published in 1879. One month later, on 21st December, the premiere took place in Copenhagen. For the majority of European countries, the play was a scandal and it was censored. The author had to change the ending and write an alternative version to make it more acceptable to be published. He would later regret it.



Indeed, the marriage link was holy, it was unthinkable for a Victorian couple to break their marriage agreement. Moreover, it was judged as unrealistic because being a woman meant being maternal, the fact that a woman could abandon her own children was unimaginable. Nora was considered to be a bad example of a barbaric woman. In addition, the place of the woman in the family was dedicated to caring for children. Despite accusations, Ibsen said he did not want to write a feminist play. Numerous actresses refused to act in the role of Nora. Surprisingly, The Hudson Theatre, in New-York, has organized showings of "A doll's house" even after 140 years, and brought forth a new era of theatre. Our protagonist Nora enters, played by Jessica Chastain, remaining perched on a simple wooden chair. Stripping the play of everything but its text focuses the audience's attention on the meaning. Its greatest effect is encouraging people to think, perceive, and behave in a new direction towards less materialism, and more positive life experiences. In addition, it is part of an honorable artistic tradition, championed by directorial giants that aims to prioritise the actors and the text and to maximise the effect on the audience.

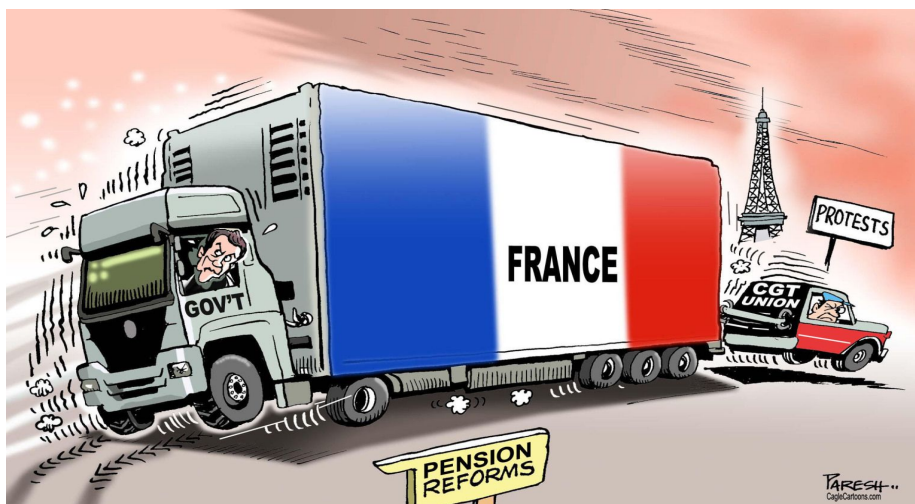
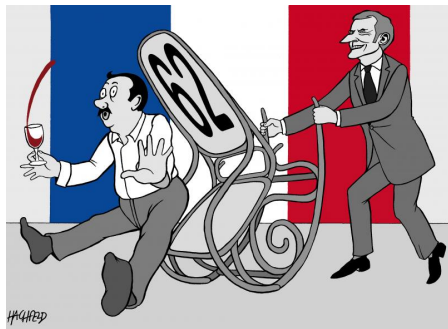
